



Bargaining update

For the last two weeks, while you walked picket lines across the country, Treasury Board refused to give CRA a mandate to negotiate wages and other core issues like telework and job security. It was only on May 1 — two weeks into a nationwide strike that the employer indicated they were ready to discuss these issues.

That is an insult to you, the 35,000 members who have been walking picket lines for the past two weeks.

You were there when Canadians needed you most, rolling out critical financial aid during the pandemic. And they need you now to help navigate tax season. But the government continues to play games and is offering you less than what they offered Treasury Board employees.

We know you're fed up and want to get back to work helping Canadians.

Thank you to each and every member for your continued support and solidarity. Together, we will make real gains for our members.
